

What is a Professional Technical Advisory Committee (TAC)?

TACs are groups of employers, employees, and labor representatives who leverage their expertise in a given field to strengthen professional and technical degree programs across Seattle Colleges. We offer more than 130 career and job training programs, ranging from short-term certificates to bachelor's degrees.

TACs are taken seriously by faculty and administrators. Committee activities focus on reviewing programs, providing recommendations, and assisting students and faculty. They support curriculum changes within a program, foster innovation, and serve as advocates for a robust, equitable education. Authority for administration and management of programs remains with Seattle Colleges.
